



Thank you for your interest in a gnome door and for inviting a gnome to move on to your property. By installing this door, you are offering a nomadic, or homeless, gnome a safe place to live. If you follow the steps below carefully, you will have the best chance of a gnome moving it.

1. Take all of the items out of the box and inspect them for damage. You should find a fully assembled door, some Spanish Moss, some stones and some bling (photo 1). If you notice any damage, email us immediately gnomedoor@elubin.com.
2. Find a tree, or wood wall, where you would like to install the gnome door (photo 2). Gnomes prefer if the spot is slightly hidden so they can come and go in private.
3. Spread out the Spanish Moss behind the door and place the door where you would like to install it on the tree or wood wall (photo 3).
4. Tap the nail through the door (there is a pre-drilled hole in the door for you to use) and into the tree/wood wall until it is flush with the door. Be careful not to miss the nail. Tap the nail until the nail head just holds the charm in place. Slide the charm down to cover the nail. (Over the next few days, the space behind the door will magically turn into a fully furnished gnome home)
5. Place the welcome walkway stones in an inviting manner in front of the door. Perhaps in a fun pattern and maybe buried half way so they will be easy to walk on. (photo 4).
6. Gnomes love shiny objects, so feel free to add additional bling near the door to help attract one.
7. Keep peeking out your window to see if you can catch a glimpse of one moving in!



* installing the door does not guarantee a gnome will move in, but they might! They do enjoy their anonymity though, so you may never get a chance to meet them.
